- Get Organized ullet
 - and learning objectives?
- Know your intended audience
- Time Yourself
- Prepare for Questions

General Presentation Tips Be inclusive

- Ensure slides, media, handouts and everything else are accessible •
 - The audience may not be able to:
 - See well (or at all)
 - Hear well (or at all)
 - Move well (or at all)
 - Speak well (or at all)
 - Understand information

Visual Aids PowerPoint, Keynote and more...

- KISS Keep It Simple 'Silly"
- Slide Shows
 - Backgrounds and Templates
 - Colors are great, but avoid the 'meaning' pothole
- Table, Charts and Graphs
 - Be prepared to talk about the relevance
- Fonts Easy to read, Clear and well spaced
- Graphics Clear with large fonts

Media Videos, Graphics and Demos

- Videos 0
 - Must be captioned
 - Youtube or Canvas are easy to use
- Demo's of Software or VR
 - Audio descriptions are needed Be descriptive!

Color and Contrast

- WCAG AA Color Contrast Ratio
 - 4:1 for graphs
 - 7:1 for text
- Color Contrast Analyser Tool
 - https://webaim.org/resources/ contrastchecker/

Text Contrast Examples

Bad Examples	Good Examples
Blue on black is bad	Yellow on black is good
Green on orange is bad	Black on orange is good
Red on green is bad	Black on green is good
Grey on purple is bad	White on purple is good


A text glow/halo around the letters can be used as the background color.

Color and Contrast

- Color Blindness
 - Color Combo's to avoid
 - Red/Green, Green/Brown
 - Green/Blue, Blue/Gray
- Avoid only using Color to convey information.
 - Use labels as well



Add Live Captions to your PowerPoints!

- Google Slides
 - Start Presentation in Google Slides
 - appear.
- PowerPoint
 - On Slide Show Ribbon select 'Always Use Subtitles'
 - Subtitle Settings. Select Language. Select position on the screen

Click More Options > Captions preferences > Turn on Toggle > Captions
